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1. Outline the Article Structure

Draft an outline based on the inverted pyramid structure, where the most critical information comes first. This typically includes:

- **Headline**: A catchy title summarizing the main point.
- **Byline**: The author's name and possibly their role.
- Lead Paragraph: The introduction that covers essential details.
- Body paragraphs: Provide details in descending order of importance
- Conclusion: wrap up the story

2. Focusing on the Headline Characteristics

- Always be concise and direct
- Typically use:
 - 1. Present Simple Tense
 - Example: "Fire Destroys Downtown Building"
 - 2. Base Verb Form (Infinitive)
 - Example: "City Council to Discuss Budget"
 - 3. Omit Articles (a, an, the)
 - Example: "Mayor Announces New Infrastructure Plan"

3. Focusing on the Lead Paragraph

The lead should capture the essence of the story. Aim to answer at least three of the following six questions (the "5 Ws and 1 H"):

o Who: Who is involved?

o What: What happened?

o Where: Where did it occur?

o When: When did it take place?

o Why: Why is it significant?

o **How**: How did it happen?

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Use strong, active language to hook the reader's attention immediately. Avoid burying crucial information; instead, present it upfront to entice further reading.

4. Focusing on the Body Paragraphs

After the lead, provide additional context and details that elaborate on the story. This can include background information, quotes from interviews, and relevant statistics that enhance understanding.

Language

- **Maintain Objectivity**: Write in the third person to keep a neutral tone. Avoid using first-person ("I") or second-person ("you") perspectives.
- Example: Instead of saying "I believe the event was successful," say "Many attendees felt the event was successful."
- Use Reporting Verbs for Quotes: When quoting sources, use reporting verbs like "said," "stated," "reported," "explained," etc.
- Example: "Mayor Chen stated that the city would provide assistance."
- Avoid Personal Opinions: Stick to facts and reported statements from sources.
- **Use Neutral Language:** Avoid emotionally charged words unless quoting someone directly.
- Use precise language relevant to the topic. For example:
- o For crime stories: "suspect," "victim," "investigation," Alleged: Claimed but not yet proven (e.g., "The alleged suspect..."), source, eyewitness, incident, authorities,
- o For community events: "participants," "organizers," "attendance."
- **Descriptive Words** for Events

Significant, devastating, tragic, shocking, unexpected, chaotic, remarkable, unprecedented.

- Phrases for Time and Place
- o Early this morning / Yesterday afternoon / Late last night.
- o At the scene of the incident.
- o In downtown Springfield / At the Maple Street complex.
